## Questions:

### Strand i

- 1. Identify two positive aspects of being a young creator in South Africa in text 1 according to Sibs Shongwe La-Mer. (2 points)
  - 'We are operating in a completely undefined space'
  - African youth have so much to say
- 2. Explain what Sipho Mpongo infers about life in the past in South Africa for young people in text 1. (2 points)

  Answers may vary but should include the following idea:

  To be creative without being banished to the generation of 1976 infers that it was impossible to be truly creative in the time of apartheid and segregation.
- 3. In text 1 several artists mention that the fact that the new South Africa is only twenty years old. Interpret how this has this been an advantage for them as artists. Clearly justify and explain your answer. (3 points)

Answers may vary but should contain some of the following ideas:

- Artists play a role in molding up and coming cities of Jo'burg and Capetown
- Stylist gets to dictate what the industry is going to be like
- They are exposed to new cultures
- They have so many interesting stories to tell
- Being a young country has given artists a fresh start
- 4. Interpret how the young artists in text 1 feel about being creative in their country today. (3 points)
  - Answers will vary but should contain some of the following idea: South Africa is a place full of energy hope and opportunity for creative people.

- diverse, erratic, lazy, questioning, challenging, confident, courageous.
- 5. State two major challenges mentioned in text 2 which Vancouver faces (2 points)
  - Hard drug use
  - Criminal Activity
- 6. With regard to text 2 state three creative activities the ACT organization seek to engage young people in. (3 points)
  Any three from the following
  - Photography
  - Film
  - Art
  - Music
- 7. Regarding text 2 explain the idea behind the ACT organization.

  Justify your answer with reference to the text. (3 points)

- 12. Evaluate the opinions about the importance of technology and new forms of communication on young artists in text one. Will this affect the audience of these artists? Justify your answer with reference to the text. (3 points)
